- Immediately increase per-student funding by \$1500
- Immediately increase per-student university and college funding by 20% and commit to annual increases matching inflation
- Establish an independent review of the funding formula
- Fund staffing for special education assistants, counsellors, social workers, ESL teachers, and other supports to provide equitable access for all students
- Enhanced funding to support de-streaming support - reduce class sizes, dedicated education workers

- Establish an Education Task Force focused on education policy and funding models, addressing staff shortages and designing special education supports and programs.
- Expand funding for additional, qualified PSSP, EAs, and other education workers
- Implement a dedicated tuition waiver to attract students into post-secondary programs in education careers facing shortages

- Increase funding to reduce class sizes and provide adequate teacher and education workers
- Reverse Ford cuts to OSAP, convert loans to grants for low and middle-income students, eliminate interest on student debt
- Ensure kindergarten staffed with full-time certified teachers and ECEs
- Update funding to account for the unique needs of remote and rural schools
- Remove two eLearning graduation requirements
- Eliminate EQAO

- Address the repair backlog and consult to adopt a Standard of Good Repair for public schools
- Create multi-stakeholder Safety and Wellbeing at School Action Table
- Create sector-specific education sector regulation under OHSA
- Double access to Student Nutrition Programs and expand to province-wide by 2030

**LIBÉRAL**

- Close the funding gap of \$1500 in K-12 and match future funding to inflation
- Establish a student-to-teacher and student-to-education worker ratio to increase access for student supports (K-12)
- Hire additional French educators
- Hold school boards accountable for funding – make schools safer for students, teachers, and education workers

- Re-introduce/reduce B.Ed. to a one-year faculty of education
- Waive postsecondary tuition for targeted programs to address teacher and education worker shortages
- Living wage for ECEs
- Negotiate fair wages for teachers and education workers through free and fair collective bargaining
- Commit to mutual respect and collaboration between Ministry and groups

- Establish a student-to-teacher ratio and student-to-education worker ratio for K-12 to increase access to support and supervision
- Clear special education-related waitlists and assessment backlog
- Eliminate interest on OSAP, raise the income threshold for repayment to \$50,000 a year
- Cap international student enrollment at 10%
- Phase out P3 model for public colleges

- Expanding funding, eligibility and flexibility for the Safe Schools Grant program to address unique staffing and infrastructure needs
- Double annual capital funding in K-12 - clear school repair backlog and install heating, A/C, and air filtration
- Reduce the education worker-to-student ratio in the Core Education Funding formula – hire more permanent staff

**ONTARIO NDP**

- Reverse Ford's \$1500 per student cut in funding
- Review the funding model, and shift to needs-based funding
- Hire more staff -teachers, educational assistants, CYWs, ECEs, PSSPs, custodial and trades workers to maintain a nurturing school environment
- Fix the student transportation funding formula

- Funding to hire additional qualified staff, including mental health professionals, EAs, child and youth workers, and other education workers.
- Reduce class sizes to increase one-on-one attention for students and to make schools safer for everyone
- Increase funding for comprehensive training for all workers and supervisors to address violence in schools

- Create a universal School Food Program for all students using fresh food prepared and grown in Ontario.
- Maintain domestic post-secondary tuition fee freeze
- Eliminate student loan interest and turn student loans into grants
- Data driven, evidence informed policy and funding to create more equitable schools
- Invest in Francophone education and French-language child-care programs

- Create a sector-specific regulation for education under the Occupational Health and Safety Act.
- Establish a single, province-wide online reporting system for violent incidents
- Establish a permanent, tri-partite Provincial Health and Safety Working Group
- Clear repair backlog within 10 years
- Invest an additional \$830 million/year to fix the repair backlog and keep up with school maintenance

**ONTARIO PC**

- Invest \$1.3 billion more to build 320 new schools and 15 school expansions, creating more than 25,000 new student spaces and more than 1,800 new licensed child-care spaces

- No new policies or strategies beyond items announced before the start of the 2025 provincial election

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- No policies or strategies announced in response to OSSTF/FEESO's platform or the Safe at school – OSSTF/FEESO Policy Paper on Building Safer School Communities (January 2025)
